# Nursery

Our Nursery children had hands on experience of planting different types of seeds, trees and plants.

Our bean planting project has taught the children about the basic needs of plants need to grow (water, light, warmth) and helped them to observe the stages of germination and growth. By planting fast-growing runner beans in clear containers, children were able to witness the roots and shoots emerge in real-time.

The learning outcomes from the activity taught the nursery children to become scientists as they made close observational drawings documenting bean plant growth. The children had great fun developing fine motor skills scooping soil when planting various types of trees and seeds, handling small seeds, and spraying water.

They all developed a sense of responsibility and patience, whilst nurturing a living plant over several weeks. Children were involved in experimenting by testing what happens to bean plant with no light, or no water, or soil. Nursery children compared the sizes of their beanstalks by measuring the beanstalks using non-standard measures.

# MONEY READY WORKSHOP

## Year 1

Our Y1 children recently took part in a hands-on Money Ready workshop, where they developed vital real-world financial skills.

Working together in small groups, they sorted coins and tackled practical math challenges that boosted their arithmetic, teamwork, and financial awareness.

To bring this science learning to life, the children took to the school's outdoor raised beds to plant their very own fruit, vegetable, and herb garden. We cannot wait to watch our young gardeners care for their plants and see their scientific predictions come to life over the coming weeks!

## Year 2

Our Year 2 budding scientists have been deeply immersed in their "Plants" topic this term, culminating in an exciting hands-on gardening session outside. In the classroom, the children developed a strong foundation of scientific knowledge, learning to identify the primary parts of a plant—including the roots, stem, leaves, and flowers—and discovering the vital functions each part performs. They also explored the essential requirements for plant growth, investigating how survival depends on the right balance of water, light, and a suitable temperature.

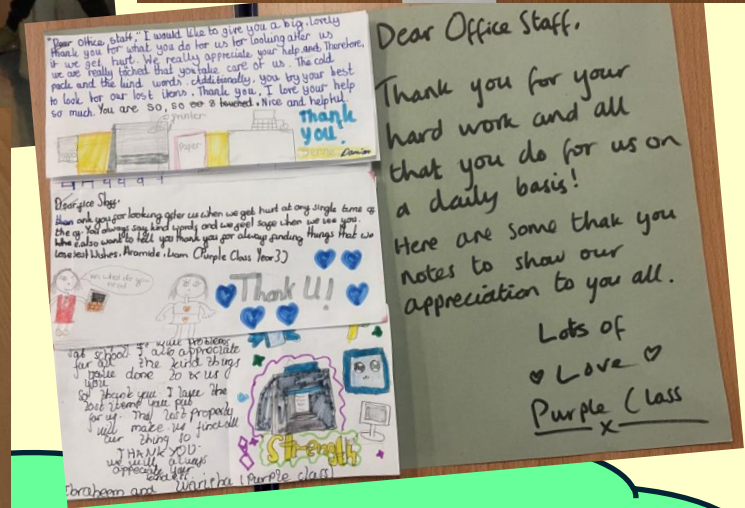
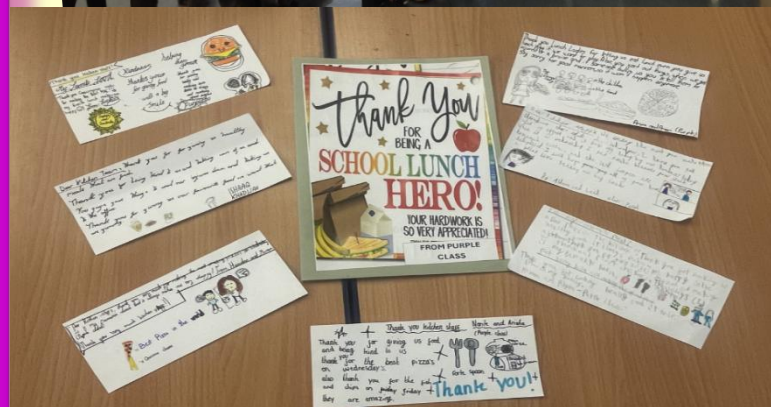
## Year 3 Beautiful Outcome

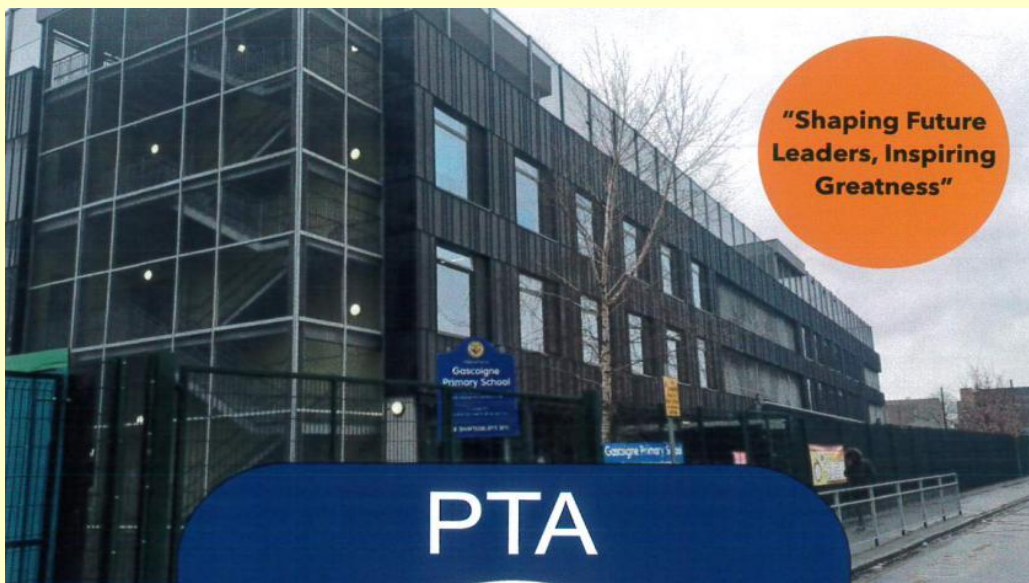
